# Special Election For Fresno City Council District 2

Progressives have the opportunity to increase the left/progressive margin on the Fresno City Council. Because Tea Party supporter Steve Brandau has moved on to the Board of Supervisors, there will be a special election on Aug. 13 to fill his vacated City Council seat.

There are two Central Valley Progressive PAC members in the race. Mike Karbassi and Oscar Sandoval will run against candidates supported by the mayor, the police chief, builders and developers.

It is unlikely that anyone will get a majority in this special election. That will lead to a runoff in November of this year.

As the election gets closer, the CVPPAC will provide more information about the candidates. With a 5-1 advantage (Democrats/ Republican) now on the Fresno City Council, we can win on a lot of issues that progressives care about. A 6-1 advantage would be awesome. In 2020, we will be eyeing electing a progressive mayor.
