## Winning Political Power in Fresno will Change Everything

We will know the results of the March 3 primary election soon. The Central Valley Progressive PAC (CVPPAC) invested significant financial resources into a Social Media campaign targeting 18–35-year-olds in southwest and southeast Fresno.

The campaign consisted of video and graphics that motivated our target audience to vote for Andrew Janz for mayor. We gave good reasons not to vote for Dyer and explained the new voting process. Our operating assumption was that if you can increase the vote among youth in the southern half of the city, progressives will win.

The CVPPAC will follow up to see if there was an increase in voter turnout and if that affected the Fresno mayoral race. If so, and this test of our theory turns out as we expect it to, we will expand our efforts to inspire young voters to elect representatives that better represent their interests and move this community in a more progressive direction. There will be more about that in a future issue of the *Community Alliance* as we collect data and analyze it.

Whatever the outcome of this month's primary election, the CVPPAC will continue working to build a movement that leads to

progressives holding political power in this community. Think of the possibilities if young people, activists in progressive organizations (e.g., environmental, LGBTQ, organized labor) and the emerging majority of people of color unite and build a political movement that takes political power locally.

We will have a thriving economy where people are paid a living wage, we will end homelessness, create more parks and improve this city in a hundred ways. Fresno will show California and the nation how things can turn around when the power of the people manifests itself as a progressive movement that wins political power.
