Voting Recomendataions?

The Fresno Center for Nonviolence (FCNV) have been often asked whether we do or don't support certain political campaigns during an election year. For example, this month CA has a recall election for its Governor, along with other local offices in California. I thought that I would get the official word from the officials that should know the answer.

According to the law, a non-profit listed as a 501 (3) (c), like the Center is, may endorse a campaign for policies changes. Policies like Medicare for All, Stop Fracking, or for the Abolishment of nuclear weapons in space or anywhere else and more but not for actual candidates running for any political office.

Since local to state officialdom seemed to waffle on the issue, it was the IRS that said, "NO." and because our existence depends on the kindhearted tax-deductible donations people like you make; we respect the IRS decision.

So, you will hear us on issues of importance to people and our world but do not ask us who or what candidate the FCNV supports because we will not! So there. - RG.
