workers are children.

Their fields are treated with pesticides. Women are sexually harassed. Families cram into small apartments or live in old cars and crude shacks. All this for \$8,000 a year in a \$650 million a year business controlled by a few large corporations.

Strawberry workers want a living wage.
They want clean drinking water and bathrooms in the fields.
They want job security, health insurance, and an end to sexual harassment and other abuses.

ALL ABOARD FOR WATSONVILLE!

A national call has gone out for a march on Watsonville, California, Sunday, April 13.

The AFL-CIO, United Farm Workers, Central Labor Councils, local unions, community and religious leaders from across the nation, and twenty thousand marchers will meet in Watsonville to show our support for the strawberry workers' campaign for justice and dignity on the job. Strawberry workers demand clean drinking water and restrooms, health insurance, and an end to abuse in the fields. A 5 cent increase per pint will raise wages 50%, just as your presence on April 13 will show corporate growers that **it can be done.**

In Fresno, the Central Labor Council will rent buses to transport union members and community activists to Watsonville.

The Council is asking people to make a \$10 donation to reserve a seat on the bus.
