Corporate Power and the American Dream is an educational program designed for unions, community groups, and school seminars around the country.

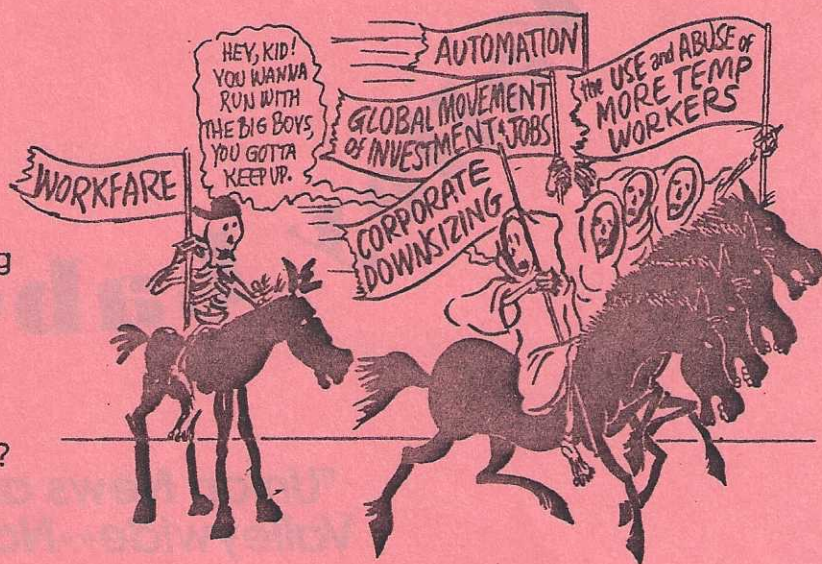
This is not a lecture! It's a small group, activity-based, interactive workshop led by worker-trainers.
